WORD OF THE WEEK

This week our word is 'dusk'

As a noun, 'dusk' means the time when the sky is getting dark at night (the darker part of twilight especially at night). As an adjective 'dusk' means dark, black or dusky. As a verb 'dusk' means to make dark or gloomy, prior to becoming dark.

E.g. The park closes at dusk.
E.g. The grey light dusked the room.
E.g. The children stopped playing at dusk, since it was getting too dark to see the ball.

Synonyms: gloom, shade, blacken, darken, black out, murky, sombre, twilight, sunset, sundown, eventide, nightfall

Please ask your child about the word 'dusk' and encourage them to use this word in their everyday talking and their homework.
