WORD OF THE WEEK This week our word is 'NATIVITY'

Nord

It is a noun. It can mean the birth of Jesus. It also means the time, place or manner of being born.

Nativity is one of many words born of the Latin verb nasci, which means "to be born."

Synonyms: birth, delivery, Christmas, Noel, beginning, creation E.g. During the nativity play, the innkeeper told Jesus's parents that there was no room for them on the night of his birth.

E.g The telling of the nativity story is a yearly tradition that celebrates Christ's birth.

Please ask your child about the word 'NATIVITY' and encourage them to use this word in their everyday talking and their homework.
