WORD OF THE WEEK - This week our word is 'FORMIDABLE'

'Formidable' is an adjective and can have several meanings. It means to cause fear or dread or apprehension, however it can also mean to inspire awe and wonder and be very impressive and it also has a 3rd meaning of something being difficult

Synonyms for formidable meaning fear / dread: terrifying, scary, fearsome, frightening, terrible, intimidating, horrible
Synonyms for formidable meaning impressive: powerful, tremendous, tough, awesome, terrific, great

Synonyms for formidable meaning difficult: taxing, challenging, daunting, colossal, overwhelming, staggering
e.g. We have a formidable task ahead of us to clear the playground of snow and ice.

e.g. She was a very formidable lady and always got what she wanted.

e.g. The enemy was formidable and the soldiers needed to rethink their tactics.

Please ask your child about the word 'FORMIDABLE' and encourage them to use this word in their everyday talking and their homework.
