REPARATION (Restorative Practice and Positive Behaviour at Eastfield)

We have had a few parents ask about 'reparation' and how we deal with 'fall outs' in school. We are a restorative school, and we believe that positive relationships are the most important thing within a classroom and within a school.

A restorative school is a school which takes a **restorative and repairing** approach to resolving conflict and preventing harm. It is a process that can help to resolve conflict. Using restorative practice enables those who have been harmed to convey the impact to those responsible, and for those responsible to acknowledge this impact and to take steps to put it right. It is important that relationships are repaired and put right - your child might talk about being part of 'reparation'. During reparation we will ask children the 5 questions below. Reparation is very powerful.

We feel that conflict resolution is a skill that our children will need throughout their life and we teach the children at Eastfield that every person in our school has a voice and has the right to be listened and heard. We acknowledge that everyone makes mistakes with their behaviour, just as they do with their learning and that we need a chance to learn from these mistakes and put them right.

This week our word is 'SWELTERING'

It is an adjective. It means to be very hot, uncomfortably hot.
