## Special Education Needs and Disability (SEND) at Eastfields

How is SEND identified?

- Parent, pupil and class teacher conversations
- In class pupil observations
- Looked at pupil's work
- Assessment information, e.g. standardised scores
- External agency reports

What SEND is supported?

- Communication and Learning, e.g. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)
- Cognition and Learning, e.g. Dyslexia
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health, e.g. ADHD
- Sensory and/or Physical Needs, e.g. Hearing impairment

How do we support SEND?

- Quality first teaching
- Reasonable adjustments (changes in class to help)
- Small group or one-to-one support
- External agency support, e.g. Wolverhampton Outreach Team
