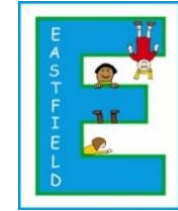


PE AND SPORTS PREMIUM AT EASTFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL



What is the Sports Premium?

Sports Premium Funding is money that is being provided by central government to improve the quality of Sport and PE in Primary Schools. This academic year each school will receive £16,000 plus an extra £10 per pupil - Eastfield Primary School will receive approx. £19,550 (based on pupil numbers) for the academic year 2019-20.

The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

All schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but there is freedom to choose how we do it. At Eastfield Primary School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. In addition, we believe that an innovative and varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

At our school the money is being used in the following ways this academic year -

- 1) To give staff an opportunity to work alongside PE specialists to improve quality of PE lessons raise fitness levels (Wolverhampton Wanderer's Foundation)
- 2) To develop a lunchtime physical activity offer for all age groups in order to increase participations in physical activities across lunch times (Wolverhampton Wanderer's Foundation)
- 3) To increase participation across the school in physical learning opportunities in order to develop healthy lifestyles in our pupils.
- 5) Employment of a community sports apprentice to promote healthy lifestyles within the community.
- 4) To provide a range of extra-curricular activities.

Sports Premium Funding at Eastfield Primary School

Plans for Sports Premium Funding 2019-20 - FUNDING ALLOCATED £19,550

Key Indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes physical activity a day in school.

Key Indicator 2: The profile of PE and Sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.

Key Indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and Sport.

Key Indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.

Key Indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport.
