Notice the concern

Stay alert for signs that someone may be vulnerable to being radicalised.

This might include changes in behaviour or the way they talk about a cause, or religion, or politics.



Check with Somebody

Talk to others who may know the person you are concerned about to check out whether they too are concerned.

Raise your concern with your line manager or the designated safeguarding lead in your organisation.



Share any concerns with your local Safeguarding Service

It is important to share any concerns around radicalisation or violent extremism with safe-guarding professionals so that the person you are concerned about can be protected from harm (see overleaf for details).

REFERRAL PROCESS

If you have a concern please submit a referral using the links below:





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The Channel Reporting Form must be completed to begin the process of keeping safe from harm anyone vulnerable to being radicalised, or who might be at risk of getting drawn into extremist behaviour.
