Dear Parents / Carers,

Welcome back and happy new year! This is a very short but very busy $\frac{1}{2}$ term, already this week we have had children out on visits and we have held a parent workshop on how to support children with ASD / Autism. Next week, teachers will be holding important curriculum meetings for parents in the main hall - it is vital that you attend these meetings, as we all know that children make the greatest progress when home and school work together. <u>See below for the dates / times of the meetings</u>.

This term we are focussing on positive mantras and thread 3 within our positive behaviour for learning policy. We will be considering how the power of positive language can help to teach the correct behaviours we want, how positive language can help to diffuse situations, how positive language can help motivate children and adults and finally how positive language can help to improve our self-esteem and mental health. Remember if you tell someone to 'not' do something then they will be tempted to do it - however if you ask for the correct behaviour rather than pointing out the wrong behaviour then you are more likely to be successful e.g. 'Walk next to me, thank you' is much more powerful than 'Please do not run off from me.'

We will also be revisiting Thread 1-routines, as this is needed after each and every weekend and holiday-school

routines and our routines can be very different.
